- 6) What are some of the symbols of the Holy Spirit? Why?
- 7) Reflection on the Creed: Explain one or more of the following: "I believe in...
  the Holy Spirit,
  the Holy Catholic Church,
  the Communion of Saints,
  the Forgiveness of Sins,
  the Resurrection of the Body and

- 8) Are you committed to the moral teachings of the Church?
